"Presidential form of government in India". This issue is under debate since the time our constitution makers first started framing our constitution. There had been a constant debate whether India should go for US model or UK model.

Presidential form of government has the advantages of its own. The present parliamentary form of government in India is rendered inefficient because of the different factors.

i) No genuine separation of power.

In parliamentary form of government we do not have separation of power between legislature and executive and thus law making by the legislature is not smooth.

The executive ministers have majority in the legislature and thus the final policy does not contain the say of minorities (effectively).

ii) Elections - Party focus and NOT person focus. Since the elections that are done now-a-days is highly focussed on Party which a citizen wants to be on the top and not the candidate, people tend to vote for a party without looking to the efficiency and ability of the candidate. Thus efficiency in politician government is effected.

iii) In the parliament, members are mostly party focussed and not policy focussed. They make policies not for the development of citizens but to show them that they are eligible to be elected the next time also.

It is thus necessary for India to start thinking of a Presidential form of government.

But having said so, there are some problems attached to Presidential form of government like.

i) India is a country of diversity. A diverse country cannot function properly under the rule of a single person.

ii) The legislature will not be able to express their views freely (as there will be nothing to deter the President).

iii) As far as legislature is considered, there can be two conditions.

- If the President's party is in majority, there will be a great biasness to him/her.

- If opposition's view is taken, it will always oppose the President.

In both the cases, free Governance will be effected.

Way forward :- As we have seen that there are pros. and cons for both the kind of government systems, we should not go for presidential system. Rather we should try to make reforms in the present system.
