

English Primary Auxiliary Verbs for Class 5

Verbs denote an action or state of being. On the basis of their functions, they are of two kinds, Main verbs and Auxiliary verbs. Auxiliary verbs are helper verbs as they help in completing the grammatical structure of a sentence. The chief primary auxiliary verbs are to be, to have, and to do.

How to be, to have, to do function in a sentence?

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Auxiliary	Funtions (they change form)	Examples
Be (simple present simple past) (is, am, are, was, were, being, been)	Linking Verb	He is hungry
Ве	Continous tense	He is jogging. (Present Continous)
	To form passive voice	She has been writting novels since last three years (Present perfect continous)
Have (have, has, had, having)	Perfect tenses	I've got a bike. (Present perfect)

Do (do, does, did, doing, done)	Negative (simple present, past)	I do not like coffee. She didn't do it.
