1. List any three health problems in India.

Solution:

Health problems differ with the difference in habitation. Listed below are three common health problems in India:

- Food and water borne diseases certain diseases are common in water-deficient areas
 and areas where water is obtained from wells or hand-pumps wherein water is
 contaminated. Few of these diseases are Diarrhea, Dysentery, and Typhoid etc. Few other
 causes are toxic levels of mineral content found in drinking water, untreated sewage or
 effluents from industries poured into water bodies.
- Insect and air-borne diseases lack of awareness amongst people in the remote areas
 about the wide range of factors causing food contamination has affected and caused
 diseases. Factors such as lack of general cleanliness can lead to breeding of houseflies,
 mosquitoes and other insects which can potentially cause diseases has often been
 overlooked.
- Unavailability of proper medical facilities and nutrition due to a combination of financial distress and medical help in remote areas has increased the mortality rate and is one of the major health concerns.
