**Solution 19:** In choice B 'flagged off' is incorrect. The usage should be 'public enthusiasm flagged, when the team kept losing'.

**Solution 20:** Option C is the most appropriate answer as it contains no grammatical error.

**Solution 21:** Statement 'b' introduces the topic. Statement 'e' extends the thought that lifestyles overlap in different cultures. Statement 'd' is more specific about lifestyles and exemplifies statement 'e'. Statement 'a' then follows with the explanation of why entanglements result. Statement 'c' concludes the paragraph. Choice 'b' is incorrect as it cannot come before statement 'e'. Thus choice 'c' - bedac' is the right choice

**Solution 22:** 'sophomoric' means 'poorly informed', 'immature' or 'lacking judgement'. Given the context here the other options are ill-fitting to say the least. 'Vignette' is a short descriptive literary sketch and thus a perfect fit as the sentence 'plenty of pauses' strengthens the uses.

**Solution 23:** Here the reference is to bear (endure or tolerate). So 'bear up' is incorrect. 'Bear up' would mean 'manage', 'survive' or 'persevere' and is not appropriate in the given context. The correct sentence is - She bore the insult with stoic silence.



**Solution 24:** Choice (D) merely indicates that the present findings are reiterations of earlier findings while other choices does not relate to such a concern.

**Solution 25:** The paragraph is about 'pessimistic Deep Ecologists' and their beliefs. Option (D) is the most appropriate has it fits well into the context, while other options are more or less clear.
