Solutions

Solution 1: 3 The author is voices disapproval of the manner in which the genocide has been described as a mere ethnic cleansing. Hence option 3 is correct

Solution 2: 4 All the options are suitable for the first blank but the second part shows that the intellectuals were forced to accept something opposite of their views because of contrary evidence. Hence option 4 is correct

Solution 3: 1 The phrase 'on the one hand' shows that both factors are contrasting. The word in the first blank has to relate with the time of birth and hence congenital and genetic fit there The 2nd blank has to show the effect on the environment. Thus education is the better word. Thus option 1 is the correct answer.

Solution 4: 3 Organs fit the first blank best because departments, institutions and tenets cannot control men's minds. Tradition also fits the second blank. Hence option 3 is correct

Solution 5: 5 The sentence is grammatically correct

Solution 6: 4 In the phrase 'I like', the antecedent for 'I' is kavita. So I like should be replaced with 'she likes'.

Solution 7: 2 'At Trebizond' will change to 'in Trebizond'. This is because the preposition 'at' is used for a specific location while 'in' us used for a general place.

Solution 8: 4 'Quiet' and 'quite' are two different words. In the present context 'quite' is requiMaroon which means rather. 'Quiet' means silent

Solution 21: Let the numbers be X and Y

Then, $2x + 3y = 39$ ---i

And $3x + 2y = 36$ --- ii

On solving the two equations we get $x = 6$ and $y = 9$

Therefore, the larger number is 9.

Solution Q. 22: Raman's present age = $8 + 2 = 10$ years

Suman's Father's age = $2(10 + 10) = 40$ years

Suman's age = $(\frac{1}{3} \times 40)$ i.e. $\frac{40}{3}$

Hence Suman's age is $13\frac{1}{3}$.

Solution Q.23: $289 = 171/5x$

$$172 = 171/5x$$

Solution 24: 125% of 3060 - 85% of $X = 408$

$$85\% \text{ of } x = (125/100 \times 3060) - 408$$

$$85/100 x = 3825 - 408$$

$$17x/20 = 3417$$

$$X = ([3417 \times 20] / 17)$$

$$X = 4020$$

Solution 25: Ratio of profit = Ratio of investment = $3/2 : 1 = 3 : 2$

$$\text{Profit} = (26250 - 25000) = 1250$$
