Solutions

Solution Q.1 - Q.6

Solution 1: (3) The SP = 106.25% of CP. Thus, CP = 29.75/1.0625 = ₹28

Solution 2: (2) 1.12 x Price = 3808 ----> Price = 3400

Solution 3: (4) A loss of 35% means a cost price of 100 corresponding to a selling price of 75. CP as a percentage of the SP would be 133.33%

Solution 4: (4) Let the number be x.

53x - 35x = 1206

18x = 1206

X = 1206 / 18 = 67

Solution 5: (1) Amount spent on bike repair = ₹89745

Amount spent on food expenses = ₹51291

Let the total amount be x.

(100-27)% of x = 89745 + 51291

73% of x = 141036

 $x = (141036 \times 100) / 73$

x = ₹193200



Solution Q.9 - Q.13

G is in the middle of E and D; C and D are adjacent; B is not adjacent to D

Thus the following two seating arrangements are possible





Solution 9: (1) E and G, C and F, D and G are all neighbours while B and G are not

Solution 10: (2) F is two sides away from E in one direction and D is two sides away from E in the other direction

Solution 11: (3) C, D, G are sitting in consecutive positions

Solution 12: (3) E and F are the neighbours of B

Solution 13: (4) G is seated opposite to F

Solution Q.14 - Q.16

Solution 14: (1) It is clear that illness happens first. One then goes to a doctor and after consultation with him, undergoes treatment to finally attain recovery

Thus, the correct order B, C, A, D, E

Solution 15: (2) Clearly, the given words when arranged in the order of various events as they occur in a man's life form the sequence: Birth, Education, Marriage, Death, Funeral.

So the correct order becomes A, E, D, B, C

Solution 16: A member is part of a family, which in turn is a part of the community. The community lives in a locality which lies within a country.

Thus, the correct order is C, A, B, D, E Hence the answer is (1)



Solutions Q.17 - Q.18

Solution 17: The word 'accessible' is apt in the second blank because the sentence talks about well-connected transport systems, while in the first blank the recluse is apt as it defines the person who leads a solitary life and avoids other people. (1)

Solution 18: 'Inevitably' means unavoidably. Also, the apt choice for the second blank is advocate, a positive form of a critic with which it contrasts (4)

Solution Q. 19 to Q. 21

Solution 19: Choice (4) is the logical sequence as Statement C elaborates on what is stated in A by saying that the 'hard times' refers to the global economic downturn and the 'vulnerable sections' are those affected by the 'gender inequalities' referred to in C.

Solution 20: Statement C follows A as it elaborates on the 'calamitous events in the international financial markets' - mentioned in A. Hence CBED is the correct sequence. (1)

Solution 21: B follows A linked by the reference to purification. It is a more generalised statement than D and so a better one to follow A. D follows B, 'it' referring to the purification and it introduces the idea of weather pattern which are continued in E and C. Thus BDEC is the correct sequence. (3)

Solution Q.22 - Q.25

Solution 22: Here, the phrasal verb 'called for' will be used, which means 'to be an appropriate occasion' (4)

Solution 23: Here the phrase 'die hard' means to disappear or change very slowly (1)

Solution 24: (2) 'Air', 'heir' and 'ere' are homophones. They have similar pronunciation but different spellings and meanings. So in this context of the given sentence; heir will suit the blank well as it means the one who inherits something.

Solution 25: (1) Different animals produce different sounds. Monkeys gibber, dogs bark, wolves howl, nightingales warble and pigs oink.
