Solution 18. Number of boxes required =  $[15 \times 1000] / 250 = 60$ 

Solution 19.  $3600 = 2^3 \times 5^2 \times 3^2 \times 2$ To make it a perfect cube it must be divided by  $5^2 \times 3^2 \times 2$  i.e. 450

Solution 20. Total age decreased =  $(24 \times 1) = n24$  months i.e. 2 years Therefore, average age of the newcomer = 18 - 2 years = 16 years

Solution 21. Let the number of people in Group A = y then ,  $16y + 20 \times 15 = 15.5 (y + 20)$ 0.5y = 10 Y = 20

Solution 22. Let the numbers be a and b, where a > b. As per the question, a + b = 37 and  $a^2 - b^2 = 185$ (a + b) (a - b) = 18537 (a - b) = 185(a-b) = 185/37 = 5

Solution 23. Ram : Shyam : Durga = 4 : 7 : 9 and (Ram + Shyam + Durga) - 56 + (8 + 8 + 8) = 80

Therefore, Durga's age(the eldest member seeing the ratio) =  $[80 \times 9/20]$  years = 36 years.

Solution 24. Let the ages of S and A = 7y and 3y Then, [7y + 6] / [3y + 6] = 5/33(7y + 6) = 5 (3y + 6)21y + 18 = 15y + 306y = 12Y = 2

Therefore, difference in the ages = 7y - 3y = 4y4 x 2 = 8 years

Solution 25. Percentage of Oxygen=  $(9.4/20 \times 100) \% = 47\%$ Therefore, percentage of carbon = [100 - (40 + 47)]% = 13%

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
