What's in News?

An annular solar eclipse will occur on 21 June, 2020.

Details:

- A rare celestial event, annular solar eclipse, popularly called as ring of fire eclipse will be visible.
- It will take place on the summer solstice, which is the longest day in the Northern Hemisphere.
- In all solar eclipse the Sun, Moon and Earth may not be perfectly aligned, and then there is a partial eclipse.
- When the three celestial bodies happen to be in a straight line, it is a Total solar eclipse.

Note:

- The oldest record of eclipse comes in Rig Veda. It describes how great Sage Artisaved the Sun from the Svarbhanu who tried to destroy him.
- Studies show that the Earth, which used to take 400 days to complete rotation, has been slowed down by eclipses.
- Ancient record of eclipse helps to know about the movement of the sun, rotation of the earth and how it is slowing down over years and its impact.
