

Best Booklist for Art & Culture for IAS Exam

Art & Culture is an important segment of the civil services examination. The subject Art & Culture is a fragment of Indian History but is vast in itself. It does not find an exclusive mention in the Prelims syllabus of the <u>IAS Exam</u>, however, UPSC Mains GS-I mentions Indian Culture - Salient aspects of Art Forms, Literature and Architecture from ancient to modern times. Read on to know which the best resources to prepare Art & Culture are and what can be the right strategy to prepare it for the UPSC Exam.

UPSC Art & Culture Books for Prelims & Mains

As mentioned earlier, Art & Culture is not mentioned separately in the syllabus of UPSC Prelims. However, as seen in the questions asked in the prelims, topics like architecture, visual art and literature become important for this stage too. You can see examples of such questions asked in previous years below:

Year 2019

Q- Building 'Kalyana Mandapam' was a notable feature in the temple construction in the kingdom of (a) Chalukya

- (b) Chandela
- (c) Rashtrakuta
- (d) Vijayanagara

Again, once an aspirant reads about the architecture of the Vijayanagar Empire, he/she will read about Kalyana Mandapam.

Year 2018

Q - In which of the following relief sculpture inscriptions is 'Ranyo Ashoka' (King Ashoka) mentioned along with the stone portrait of Ashoka?

- (a) Kanganahalli
- (b) Sanchi
- (c) Shahbazgarhi
- (d) Sohgaura



Aspirants will read about inscriptions when they read about Mauryan Empire and also when they read about Architecture of Mauryan Empire.

Q - With reference to the Mian Tansen, which one of the following statement is not correct

- (a) Tansen was the title given to him by Emperor Akbar
- (b) Tansen composed Dhrupads on Hindu god and goddesses
- (c) Tansen composed songs on his patrons
- (d) Tansen invented many Ragas

Now, it can be said that this question is not related to art and culture, but in reality, it is. Once an aspirant reads about Performing Arts and under it, when they will read about classical music, they will come to know about Ragas, Dhrupads and with that they will know about Tansen.

Year 2013

Some Buddhist rock-cut caves are called Chaityas, while the others are called Viharas. What is the difference between the two?

- a. Vihara is a place of worship, while Chaitya is the dwelling place of the monks
- b. Chaitya is a place of worship, while Vihara is the dwelling place of the monks
- c. Chaitya is the stupa at the far end of the cave, while Vihara is the hall axial to it
- d. There is no material difference between the two

The question had come from the Buddhist architecture which is a sub-topic of Architecture mentioned in the syllabus of the <u>UPSC Mains</u>.

Solution (b)

Year 2012

Q. Lord Buddha's image is sometimes shown with the hand gesture called 'Bhumisparsha Mudra'. It symbolizes

(a) Buddha's calling of the Earth to watch over Mara and to prevent Mara from disturbing his meditation

(b) Buddha's calling of the Earth to witness his purity and chastity despite the temptations of Mara

(c) Buddha's reminder to his followers that they all arise from the Earth and finally dissolve into the Earth, and thus this life is transitory

(d) Both the statements (a) and (b) are correct in this context

For this question, an aspirant can answer once he reads about the art and literature of Buddhism.

- 1. The first and foremost thing is to refer to previous year question papers and analyse what kind of questions are actually asked in the exam. You can get <u>topic-wise GS 1 questions</u> from the linked article.

- b. Indian Philosophy Schools
- c. Architecture of all types
