
## Difference Between IAS and IPS

IAS officers help in Public Administration and Policy Formulation and Implementation	IPS officers are charged with investigating crime and maintaining public order in the area where they are posted

It is the topmost position of all the administrative services	Second in Rank after the IAS
The Indian Civil Services was the forerunner of the Indian Administrative Services. After the passing of the Government of India Act 1919, it became one of the arms of the All India Services	The Indian Police Service is a successor to the Indian Imperial Police. The Indian Imperial Police was formed in 1861 after the Indian Councils Act 1861 was passed by the British government
After the recommendation of the 7th Pay Commission, the basic IAS Salary begins at Rs. 56,100 House Rent Allowance (HRA) and Travel Allowance (TA) is Extra	Post the recommendation of the 7th Pay Commission, an IPS salary varies from 56,100 INR per month to as high as 2,25,000 INR per month upon attaining the post of the Director-General of Police (DGP).
