The District Collector is the highest Officer of revenue administration in the district. In revenue matters he/she is responsible to the Government through the Divisional Commissioner and the Financial Commissioner (Revenue).

Deputy Commissioner is the Executive Head of a District. Deputy Commissioner reports to the Divisional Commissioner (Secretary rank officers at the State Level). The Deputy Commissioner dons different roles depending on different occasions.
