

27 Aug 2020: PIB Summary & Analysis

1. UDAN Scheme

Context:

78 New Routes Approved Under UDAN 4.0.

Details:

- Under this fourth round of the <u>UDAN scheme</u>, priority has been given to enhancing connectivity to remote and regional areas of the country.
- The focus has been given to the north-eastern region, hilly states and islands.
- So far under this regional connectivity scheme, 766 routes have been sanctioned.
- Under UDAN 4.0, the operation of helicopters and seaplanes has also been incorporated.

2. ASEAN-India Business Council Virtual Meet

Context:

ASEAN-India Business Council virtual meet held.

India – ASEAN Trade:

- The Union Commerce Minister said in the meet that India-ASEAN trade can reach \$300 billion and the two can resolve their differences by addressing concerns of all nations and businesses.
- In FY20, India's merchandise trade with <u>ASEAN</u> was \$86.86 billion.
- The two sides inked a free trade agreement (FTA) and have now agreed to review the ASEAN-India Trade in Goods Agreement that was signed in 2009 after New Delhi complained of a burgeoning trade deficit with the grouping.
- India had a trade deficit of \$23.88 billion with ASEAN in FY20.
- Since the India-ASEAN Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement (CECA) was implemented in 2010, bilateral trade increased from just \$57 billion to \$77 billion in about a decade.
 - India is not too happy with the ASEAN-India CECA as it believes that it has led to more benefits for businesses in the bloc due to various non-tariff barriers erected by ASEAN countries.
- Moreover, lax implementation of rules of origin has also led to Chinese goods coming into India through some ASEAN nations at preferential tariff rates.
- ASEAN is also part of the <u>Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP)</u> trade bloc that India exited last year.

3. Bureau of Police Research and Development (BPR&D)

Context:

Golden jubilee anniversary of BPR&D on 28th August.



About BPR&D:

- The Bureau of Police Research and Development was raised in 1970 through a resolution of the Ministry of Home Affairs, GOI, with a mandate to promote excellence in policing, promote the speedy and systematic study of police problems, apply science and technology in the method and techniques by the Police.
- The primary objective of the Bureau is to modernise the police force of the country.
- The Bureau is headed by a Director-General and is composed of the following divisions:
 - Research division
 - Correctional administration
 - o Development division
 - o Training division
 - o Administration division
 - National Police Mission (NPM) Division

4. Textile Grand Challenge 2019

Context:

Grand finale of the Textile Grand Challenge 2019 organised by the Ministry of Textiles.

About the Textile Grand Challenge:

- The aim of the challenge was to bring forward innovative ideas by start-ups/entrepreneurs for the development of cost-effective and low-weight carry bags using jute bio-mass, jute plant-based bio-polymer and cotton fibre waste to phase out plastic bags.
- The challenge was organised by the Textiles Ministry along with the National Jute Board, and the Start-Up India team of the Department for Promotion of Industry & Industrial Trade (DPIIT).
- Under the challenge, innovative solutions were sought for alternatives to single and multi-use plastic bags using domestically grown natural fibres, jute and cotton.
