YuWaah Youth Skilling Initiative - Key Points

The Minister of Women and Child Development, Mrs. Smriti Irani announced UNICEF's YuWaah in India on November 1, 2019 in the Rajya Sabha. Given below are a few key points about this initiative:

- Generation Unlimited, called YuWaah in India, is a multi-stakeholder alliance which aims to facilitate youth to gain relevant skills for productive lives and the future of work.
- The project has been launched by United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF)
- Young people, aged between 10 to 24 years will be benefited through this initiative and skill development and employment opportunities will be provided to them
- Equal opportunities will be provided to both girls and boys
- People from private sector, public organisations, international and local organisations, and government agencies have been brought together through this Generation United (GenU) to tackle with the challenge of investing in learning
- The initiation of this project is a great achievement for India as India is one of the first countries to launch its national initiative for a Generation Unlimited movement
- The Generation Unlimited movement had started off in New York in 2018

YuWaah is an initiative which will work in parallel to the India Prime Minister, Narendra Modi's path of AtmaNirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan, aiming at creating opportunities for the people of India, with India itself.

Objectives of YuWaah

Since the education of youth today will define the future of the country, UNICEF's YuWaah has also launched with the aim to empower the youth of the country. Given below are the main objectives of YuWaah in India:

• Its key mission is to promote access to foundational, transferable and 21st century skills for youth inside and outside formal education systems



- Defining foundational skills, life skills and flexible learning and identifying and scaling impactful delivery models is also an important objective of this initiative
- The project also aims at creating a platform to facilitate the integration of career guidance with the school curriculum
- UNICEF also intends to collaborate with the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports to encourage youngsters to choose their own path and strive to achieve it
