Geography Question Paper - UPSC Mains 2013-19

The questions have been divided into physical geography, climate, resources, urbanization and industrial location.

You can go through Geography Questions for Mains paper of the <u>IAS Exam</u> and get a fair idea about the kind of questions asked by the UPSC each year.

You should relate current affairs and the UPSC syllabus so that you can predict questions for the forthcoming exam.

For instance, in 2013 there was a question on the naming of cyclones because Cyclone Phailin had occurred that year. Similarly, prepare questions keeping in mind the current events and happenings that frequent the newspapers.

Physical Geography

1. How can the mountain ecosystem be restored from the negative impact of development initiatives and tourism?

- 4. Bring out the causes for more frequent landslides in the Himalayas than in Western Ghats.

- 2. What characteristics can be assigned to the monsoon climate that succeeds in feeding more than 50 percent of the world population residing in Monsoon Asia?

- 1. Explain the factors responsible for the origin of ocean currents. How do they influence regional climates, fishing and navigation?
- 2. How far do you agree that the behaviour of the Indian monsoon has been changing due to humanizing landscapes? Discuss.

- 1. Tropical cyclones are largely confined to South China Sea, Bay of Bengal and Gulf of Mexico. Why?
- 2. Most of the unusual climatic happenings are explained as an outcome of the El-Nino effect. Do you agree?
- 3. Bring out the relationship between the shrinking Himalayan glaciers and the symptoms of climate change in the Indian subcontinent.

- 1. The recent cyclone on the east coast of India was called "Phailin". How are the tropical cyclones named across the world?
- 2. Bring out the causes for the formation of heat islands in the urban habitat of the world.
- 3. What do you understand by the phenomenon of temperature inversion in meteorology? How does it affect the weather and the habitants of the place?

- 5. In what way micro-watershed Development projects help in water conservation in drought prone and semi-arid regions of India.

- 1. What are the economic significances of discovery of oil in Arctic Sea and its possible environmental consequences?
- 2. India is well endowed with fresh water resources. Critically examine why it still suffers from water scarcity.
- 3. The states of Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand arc reaching the limits of their ecological carrying capacity due to tourism. Critically evaluate.

- 1. Critically evaluate the various resources of the oceans which can be harnessed to meet the resource crisis in the world.
- 2. How does India see its place in the economic space of rising natural resource rich Africa?

- 1. With growing scarcity of fossil fuels, the atomic energy is gaining more and more significance in India. Discuss the availability of raw material required for the generation of atomic energy in India and in the world.
- 2. It is said the India has substantial reserves of shale oil and gas, which can feed the needs of country for quarter century. However, tapping of the resources doesn't appear to be high on the agenda. Discuss critically the availability and issues involved.

- 2. Smart cities in India cannot sustain without smart villages. Discuss this statement in the backdrop of rural urban integration.

1. Discussion the various social problems which originated out of the speedy process of urbanization in India.

Industrial Location

- 1. Can the strategy of regional resource-based manufacturing help in promoting employment in India?
- 2. Discuss the factors for the localisation of agro-based food processing industries of North-West India.

2018

What is the significance of Industrial Corridors in India? Identifying the industrial corridors, explain their main characteristics.

2017

Petroleum refineries are not necessarily located nearer to crude oil producing areas, particularly in many of the developing countries. Explain its implications.

2014

- 1. Whereas the British planters had developed tea gardens all along the Shivaliks and Lesser Himalayas from Assam to Himachal Pradesh, in effect they did not succeed beyond the Darjeeling area. Explain.
