






For The Teacher

For The Teacher



For The Teacher

At First, the teacher will check the matching done by the students. Then, the teacher will ask every student about his/her favourite bird and animal. The teacher will write names of students' favourite animals and birds on the board.

The teacher will give a brief introduction about these birds and animals. By explaining the nature of these birds and animals, the teacher will try to develop a sense of love and kindness towards them among the students.



Students will sit on the floor in a circle. They will place their index fingers on the floor. Either the teacher or a student will loudly say:

Crow fly

Every student will raise his/her hand in the air

Sparrow fly

Every student will raise his/her hand in the air

Buffalo fly

Some students will raise their hands in the air hastily or carelessly. Other children will laugh over that. In this way, the teacher will explain that a buffalo can walk on the earth but cannot fly in the sky.

- In this way, the game will continue with more names of animals and birds.
- Through this game, students will identify animals / birds that can fly and differentiate between animals and birds.
- After that, students will identify sounds made by birds and animals. Students can make this game more interesting by producing sounds of their favourite birds or animals.



The teacher will recite this poem and the students will recite after the teacher.







Ans. They can also be kept in the cupboard. Expired medicines should be thrown away.




Electrical switches should 4. not be used with wet hands.

For The Teacher

Note: On the basis of the pictures given above, the teacher will briefly tell the students some safety measures to avoid such incidents:

Wild-Animals
