Objectives of Dairy Sahakar Scheme

- Transportation and storage of milk and milk products
- Managing exports of dairy products

Who will regulate the Dairy Sahakar Scheme?

The scheme will be implemented by NCDC under the Ministry of Cooperation, Government of India. National Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC) will be extending financial assistance to eligible cooperatives for dairy activities.

A total of Rs 5000 crore will be invested in the scheme to realize the vision, "from cooperation to prosperity".
