

National Education Day [November 11]

National Education Day is celebrated in India on November 11th every year to commemorate the birth anniversary of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad. He was a great freedom fighter, eminent educationist and the **first Union Minister of Education** (from 15 August 1947 to 2 February, 1958).

National Education Day, 2021

- In the year 2021, National Education Day was celebrated on November 11 and all the prominent leaders, including the Prime Minister of India, paid their tribute to Maulana Abul Kalam Azad for his remarkable contribution to Indian education and freedom struggle.
- This year it was the 134th birth anniversary of Bharat Ratna Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, India's first Minister for Education.

History of National Education Day

- In 2008, the Ministry of Human Resource Development (HRD) notified that November 11 would be celebrated as National Education Day to pay tribute to Maulana Abul Kalam Azad on his birth anniversary.
- This date has been chosen because of the significant contributions of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad to the Indian education system.

About Maulana Abul Kalam Azad

- Maulana Abul Kalam Azad was born in Mecca, Saudi Arabia in 1888, and he pursued traditional Islamic education.
- He was one of the founding members of the Jamia Milia Islamia University. His contributions
 were helpful in shaping the modern education system of the country.
- In 1992, Maulana Abul Kalam Azad was posthumously honoured with India's highest civilian award - Bharat Ratna.

 Education Day in organising seminars, symposia, essay writing, elocution competitions,



workshops and rallies with banners, cards and slogans on the importance of education and the nation's commitment to all aspects of education.

- Providing universal access to quality education is the key to India's continued ascent, and leadership on the global stage in terms of economic growth, social justice and equality, scientific advancement, national integration, and cultural preservation.
- The global education development agenda reflected in Goal 4 (SDG4) of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, adopted by India in 2015 - seeks to "ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all" by 2030.

Goal 4 of SDG - "Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all"

 Such a lofty goal will require the entire education system to be reconfigured to support and foster learning so that all the critical targets and goals (SDGs) of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development can be achieved.

Why National Education Day is celebrated on November 11?

He also promoted adult literacy, universal primary education, free and compulsory education for all children up to the age of 14, girls' education, and diversification of secondary education and vocational training.
