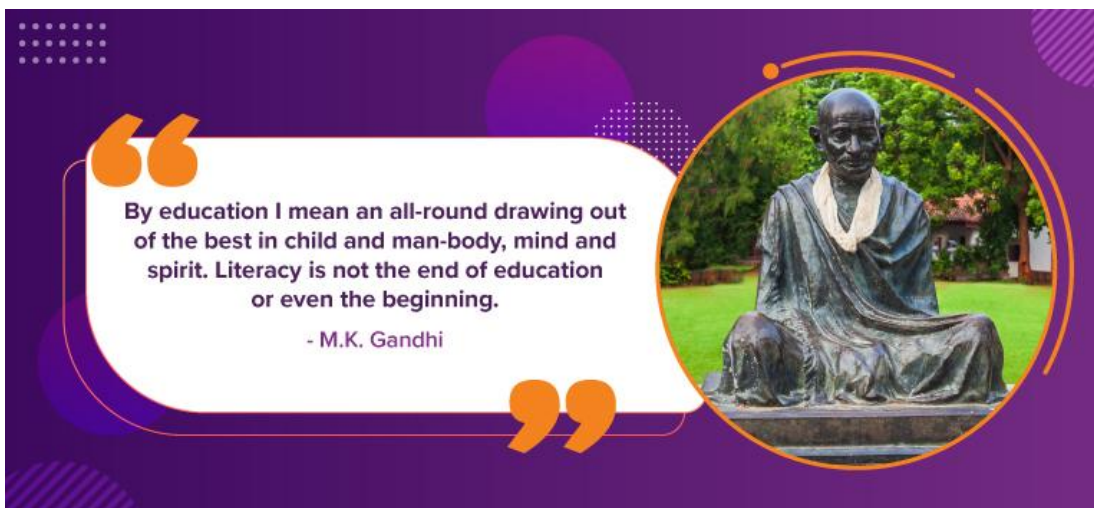

### **1. India's maiden trilateral exercise with Mozambique and Tanzania**

**Syllabus: Security Challenges and their Management**

**Prelims: Joint exercises involving India**

**Context:**

- The first edition of India-Mozambique-Tanzania Trilateral Exercise (IMT TRILAT), commenced Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania.

**Details:**

- It is a joint maritime exercise among the navies of the three countries including both harbour and sea phases.

- The main objectives include capability development to address common threats through training and sharing of best practices, enhancing interoperability, and strengthening maritime cooperation.

**Significance of the exercise:**

- The exercise is a reflection of India's attempt to enhancing maritime security and cooperation with maritime neighbours in the Indian Ocean Region and promoting SAGAR, Safety and Growth for All in the Region.

**Prelims: Goa maritime symposium**

**Context:**

- The fourth edition of the Goa Maritime Symposium is being conducted by the Naval War College (NWC) at Goa.

**Background:**

- The Goa Maritime Symposium is a forum for fostering collaborative thinking, cooperation and mutual understanding between India and key maritime nations of the Indian Ocean Region.
- It was first held in 2016 and is conducted biennially.

**Details:**

- The symposium is seeing participation from countries including Bangladesh, Comoros, Indonesia, Madagascar, Malaysia, Maldives, Mauritius, Myanmar, Seychelles, Singapore, Sri Lanka, and Thailand, besides India.
- The theme of GMS-2022 is "Maritime Security Challenges in the Indian Ocean Region: Converting Common Maritime Priorities into Collaborative Mitigation Frameworks".
