


Whose Line is It?



Fatima keeps her stump in a standing position.


Jasbir keeps his stump in a slanting position.

Raima keeps her stump in a sleeping position.



Match the picture of each child with the correct line.









What about writing letters using straight lines? Which ones are easy?


Answer:

Yes, traffic policemen sometimes make curved lines.


