India is playing an enormous interest in establishing a relationship with various countries around the globe. Integration of military exercises is an unavoidable obligation for the contemporary combat zone. Joint military exercises are essential for the cooperation of countries apart from economic and diplomatic cooperation.

Cooperation in the military field in the Indian armed forces received a motivation post-Kargil. The most significant benefit of joint military exercises is 'strategic signalling'.

This is an important concept for many major government exams, including the <u>UPSC IAS exam</u>.

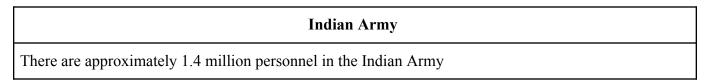

Facts About Indian Army for UPSC

The table below gives a few important and interesting facts about the Indian Army for the UPSC Exam:





The largest standing volunteer army in the world is the Indian Army with 1,129,900 Active personnel and 960,000 Reserves

There are recruiting zones in the country for the purpose of recruitment in the Indian Army

The headquarters of the Indian Army is in New Delhi

- The first headquarters of the Indian Army Red Fort, Delhi
- Today Portions of South Block along with a gigantic, architecturally modern Sena Bhavan adjacent

In India, the command headquarters is known as Field Army with a General Officer Commanding-in-Chief presiding over matters in the rank of a (three-star) Lieutenant General.

The head of the Indian Army staff is called the Chief of Army Staff (COAS.)

- The current Army Chief is General Manoj Pande
- Before that, General Mukund Naravane was the Indian Army Chief

Indian Army also has a Vice Chief and two Deputy Chiefs of Army Staff

In the Indian Army, the corps are the field force. They are of two types – Holding Corps and Strike Corps

Largely, the topic, India Army Exercises, is covered under bilateral relations of India, and also under the security section of the <u>IAS Syllabus</u> of GS 2 and GS 3 respectively. Hence, aspirants should remember the names of these exercises while writing any answer that involves either of these sections.

Frequently Asked Questions about Joint Military Exercises of the Indian Army Q. Why are Joint Military exercises between armies important?

A military exercise involving two or more nations is a measure to test the performance of the armed forces without engaging in the battlefield. These are useful in the case of joint military operations be it in war or in operations other than war such as disaster relief, and humanitarian aid.



Q. What is Vajra Prahar?

Vajra Prahar' is a Special Forces joint training exercise conducted alternately in India and the US to share the best practices and experiences in areas such as joint mission planning and operational tactics as also to improve interoperability between the Special Forces of both nations.

Q. What is the name of the joint military exercise of India & France?

France and India have built on their longstanding air force cooperation through the tactical bilateral exercise, Garuda, held alternately in France and India, as well as other joint exercises.

Q. What is Yudh Abhyas?

The 18th 'Yudh Abhyas,' a joint military exercise between India and the United States, was held in October 2022. The joint military exercise between India and the United States took place in Auli in Uttarakhand.

Q. What is EX SAMPRITI - X?

As part of the ongoing India-Bangladesh bilateral defence cooperation, a joint military training exercise Ex SAMPRITI-X is being conducted at Jashore Military Station in Bangladesh from 05 June to 16 June 2022.

Q. What is the name of military exercise between India and Japan?

Ex Dharma Guardian - 2022 is a joint military exercise between India and Japan, is being conducted at the Foreign Training Node in Belagavi. The annual training event for the exercise is being held in India since 2018.

LAMITIYE - 2022 is a joint military exercise between India and which country?

The 9th Joint Military Exercise LAMITIYE-2022 between the Indian Army and Seychelles Defence Forces (SDF) is being conducted at Seychelles Defence Academy (SDA), Seychelles from 22 March to 31 March 22.
