Across the Solar System with Mila

• Jupiter

Gas Giant 11.8 Earth years 139,822 km, or about 11 Earths Jupiter, the fifth planet from the Sun, is a giant planet in every possible manner! It's so big that it could easily accommodate 1,300 Earths or more inside it. Additionally, it weighs more than twice as much as all the other planets combined. As the biggest planet in the Solar System, it was named after Jupiter, king of the ancient Roman gods.

The days on Jupiter are the shortest on any planet in our Solar System – just about 10 Earth hours long, and it takes it roughly 12 Earth years to complete one round around the Sun. The planet is located just past the asteroid belt, five times farther away from the Sun than the Earth, and that's why it has a surface temperature of around -145 °C. There is no solid ground on Jupiter, since it is a big ball of gas. Jupiter's hydrogen ocean is the biggest in the solar system. Telescopes reveal a foggy environment on Jupiter with a variety of colourful bands and patches. The Great Red Spot on Jupiter has been examined by scientists for years. Jupiter also has several rings, but they are not as vivid as Saturn's and are made up of dust rather than ice.

Jupiter is not suitable for life but some of its 53 moons contain oceans under their crusts, which may be capable of hosting living organisms. The European Space Agency and NASA are planning trips to Jupiter's moons in the next decade to find out whether they have liquid oceans and possibly life. So far, nine spacecraft have visited Jupiter: seven flew by while the other two were in orbit. Juno, the most recent one, reached Jupiter in 2016.
