Type: Length of a year: Size (diameter): Ice Giant 165 Earth years 49,244 km, or about 4 Earths Neptune is the eighth and last planet in our solar system, and also the farthest from the Earth. Johann Galle discovered the planet in 1846 using the mathematical calculations of Urbain Joseph Le Verrier, a French mathematician. After Le Verrier's suggestion, the planet was given the name of the Roman deity of the sea.

Because Neptune is so far from the Sun, it takes light 4 hours to get from the Sun to Neptune, but only 8 minutes to get from the Sun to Earth. The planet Neptune is 57 times the size of Earth. One Neptunian day is about 16 hours long on Earth, and one Neptunian year is about 60,190 days long on Earth. Neptune has six rings, although they are difficult to see. In addition, 14 known moons orbit it.

There is no solid ground on Neptune. Neptune is blue because the methane in its atmosphere absorbs red light. It's important to note that the Great Dark Spot, which is about the size of Earth, is only one of the multiple storm systems in Neptune's atmosphere.



In 1989, more than 140 years after its discovery, NASA's Voyager 2 was the first and only spacecraft to conduct in-depth research on Neptune. Voyager 2 brought back a lot of information about Neptune and its moons. It also confirmed that the giant planet had faint rings like the other gas planets. Our scientists use the Hubble Space Telescope among other large ground-based telescopes to learn more about this planet and the rest of the universe
