

Almost every one of us has a television at home. The word television comes from the word 'tele', which means 'far away,' and 'vision,' which means 'sight.'

The first television sets were black-and-white and appeared sometime in the 1930s. At the time they were very heavy and almost shaped like boxes. Today, the televisions we have at home are much lighter and flatter, and more colourful.

The first TV remote control, called "Lazy Bones," was made by a company called Zenith in 1950. It was wired and had only one button to change channels. Remote controls have gotten better since then, and now they are a standard part of every TV set.







From broadcasting just the news to running OTT apps, television has come a long way. All the television stations have their streaming services, even though they were slow to embrace the internet. With new things happening in fields like virtual reality, television will keep changing for a long time.

Major sporting events, like the Olympics, Football World Cup, and NBA Finals, are some of the most-watched TV broadcasts.
