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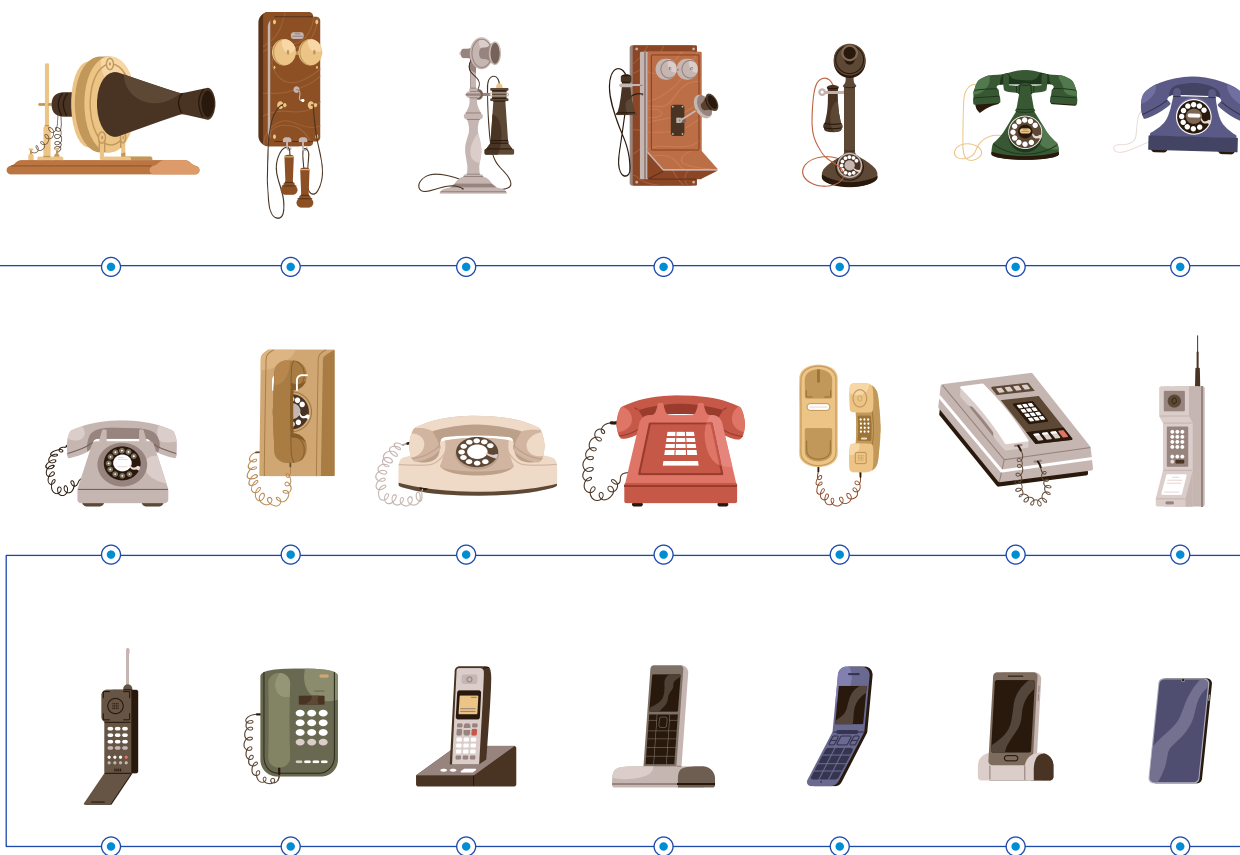

EVOLUTION OF TELEPHONES



The telephone is an amazing invention in history. People living far away can easily communicate and talk to each other now over the phone. This was not possible in the olden times before the invention of the telephone.

The **credit** for inventing the first telephone goes to Alexander Graham Bell. Here's a picture of Alexander Graham Bell using one of his first telephones to call from New York to Chicago.

Credit (noun) – Praise or honour given to someone for their actions or quality



There are many types of telephones out there. The traditional telephone also known as fixed phone or landline requires a connection with a wire to work. A mobile phone, also called a cell phone, is a phone you can carry with you. These became very popular in the late 1980s. Today, there are cellphones that can do more than just make calls, like send SMSs. Some, called smartphones, can also run computer programmes called applications or apps.



In the past, telephones were connected with wires running from each telephone to a central point called a telephone exchange. So if you wanted to call someone, you first had to talk to an operator sitting at the telephone exchange. The operator would then connect your call to the person you wanted to speak to. Group phone lines meant everyone could hear the discussion at once.



Most phones have numbers. Today's phone numbers are 7 to 10 digits long. An area code is a part of several phone numbers. It ensures that two numbers aren't the same. Each place and nation has its unique code.

For example, the area code for Delhi is 011, Mumbai is 022, and Bengaluru is 080. Because of this, we can use the same number in many other places. Similarly, the dialling code for the country of India is +91. There are also emergency numbers for each country that can be called to get help. This number in India is 112. This number may be reached at any time, day or night.



The phone has come a long way since it was first built. Before, the phone was a simple tool, but now it can be used to send voice, sound, information, video messages, and so much more!
